- 1) <u>Foreign Policy</u> International Engagement or Disengagement, Inflation and Tariffs, Unauthorized migration and its effect on our area.

We could explore how federal money is helping us pay for improvements. What are the key issues regarding infrastructure? e.g. Kellogg lake/creek progress
- 7) Mental Health
 - a. We could explore how our community's young people are dealing with the social network and personal image or abuse from our local high school.
